BIOGRAPHICAL:

Professor Leonard W. Thornton-White. Born 16 June 1901. Educated Hull, England, John Bilson, FRIBA, also British School at Rome, and short periods in west and central European metropolises (e.g. Paris, Berlin). Professional education at Bartlett School, University of London.

In 1937 UCT's first Professor of Architecture, Dean of the Faculty of Fine Art and Architecture; many other UCT posts and committees E.G. Academic Freedom; died 25 September 1965.

In Dec. 1950 UCT refuses Govt. order that it "must not accept Non-European students from outside the Union"; a Pretoria professor resigns because his University Council order that there must be no English books left in his dept. by 1951, although there are no Afrikaans text-books in that subject Letter to L.S. 19.10.1949 refers to political appointments in the civil service; it takes "several months" to get replies from Pretoria even on routine matters; passports withheld at whim of a Minister; petrol control threatened; "quite unbelievable manifesto on Christian National Education"; one Afrikaans university begins all lectures (even in the Science Faculty) with prayers; Wits "panics" into ordering several staff to learn Afrikaans. "I can detect a gradual stiffening of University opinion to be determined to make a very strong stand if the Govt. is ever stupid enough to try to dictate to us what and how we shall teach".
